Pre-reading activity 1:

Our school with no plants

Key concepts

Students should begin to:

• understand the importance of plants in our everyday lives.

Resources

- A3 paper or butchers' paper (one piece per student)
- markers, pens, coloured pencils or paints

Lesson steps

- 1. Take the students on a 'plant-hunt' through the school.
- 2. On your walk, discuss:
 - features of the plants (what they smell like, feel like, look like etc)
 - differences/similarities between plants (compare grass and trees and shrubs)
 - 3. When you are back in the classroom, ask students to close their eyes and imagine the school without any plants.
 - 4. Have students paint or draw a picture of the school with no plants.
 - 5. In a circle, discuss the benefits of having plants. Guide students to think about what we use plants for, where our food comes from and how animals use plants.

Further activities:

Paint or draw a picture of the school with lots of plants. Ask students to compare the 'with plants' and 'without plants' pictures and discuss or write which they think is better.
